

# LMS Privacy Survey

## Big Takeaways

**Administrators' faculty's and students' perceptions regarding LMS data access are consistent across most questions. Where there are differences, student's perceptions of data access are consistently more-private than faculty and administrators.**

**Where there are differences, faculty's perceptions about data access are consistently more private than administrators'.**

**Administrators, faculty, and students were able to answer more than half of the questions correctly, suggesting that understandings of data access are generally accurate across the board.**

**Questions about course download history (e.g., whether a student is currently logged in, or the number of times a student has logged in), all three groups (administrators, faculty, and students) overestimated how public this data is.**

**Even though students are generally confident that their LMS data is protected, they are still less confident than faculty and administrators.**

**Despite some differences in answers, all four data protection problems (Q18-21) found some level of agreement between all three groups, indicating overall confidence in the protection of student data.**
